Trustee's Report

The upstairs children's room is finished and has been in use for several weeks now. The upstairs floor and all the stair wells have new carpet. The Selah Center and new choir room have new HVAC units and reopened skylights. The new Southside entrance and sidewalk has been completed, and most exciting of all is the elevator is up and running. For the first time in its history all the major levels and rooms of the church building are handicapped accessible! We still have a few more weeks to go as the hardwood floors are being installed on the main level, and the stairs to the lower level need to be finished. This has been an exciting journey for the church and we are beginning a new chapter at the Church at Ponce & Highland.

Additionally, Ann serves on the Aging Services Task Force of the Atlanta Regional Commission and as a Board member of the Georgia Gerontology Society.

In 2004, Ann began to serve as Chair of the Long Term Care Ombudsman Advisory Council since its inception by Becky Kurtz, State Long Term Care Ombudsman. She advocates with the State Office Ombudsman on issues concerning improvement of the lives of long-term care residents and consumers, and personally interacts with the Ombudsmen in working to achieve funds for the residents and legal protections for those being abused and/or exploited.

Ann has been selected to receive the Janet Tulloch Memorial Advocacy Award in November 2015. A committee of the organization's leadership considered a number of applicants and chose her as the 2015 recipient.
